

Document Your Birds

Each year, we receive reports of rare or unusual birds. Without documentation it can be hard for our biologists to confirm these rare sightings. Photos are always helpful, even if you consider them poor quality.

Photos of Purple Finch, Cooper's Hawk, Sharp-shinned Hawk, Red-headed Woodpecker, and Chipping Sparrow photos are particularly helpful as these species can be confused for others. See our **Commonly Confused Species** guide on our website to learn more.

New This Year: Count your Chipmunks.

Many have already noted a rise in the numbers of Eastern Chipmunks feeding below their bird feeders. While, we have counted Red and Gray Squirrels for many years, we are adjusting the Survey to warmer winters and counting Eastern Chipmunks for the first time this year.
